



PHARAOH LAKE WILDERNESS AREA

24 Pharaoh Lake Horse Trail System Trail starts on the south side of the wilderness area just north of Brandt Lake. You'll follow Pharaoh Lake Brook to the outlet of Pharaoh Lake and then follow the lake's southern shore to several lean-tos at 5 miles.

Starts near the Village of Adirondack on
Schroon Lake's eastern shore. The ride
parallels Sucker Brook and continues east
to the outlet of Pharaoh Lake after 5.8
miles where it intersects with the Pharaoh




