There is more freshwater shoreline in the Adirondack Region than in all of Vermont and New Hampshire combined - more than 3.000 ponds and lakes, 6.000 miles of rivers and uncounted

There are so many waterways in the Adirondacks that early settlers used them as roads through what was then an impenetrable wilderness. The Adirondack Region is still pristine and the waterways are still highways. Now, however, they lead to memorable getaways.



If you look at a map of the region, you will notice that most of the place names are related to water: Lake George, Lake Placid, Blue Mountain Lake, North River, Newton Falls, Raquette Lake, St. Regis Falls, Tupper Lake, and on and on.

Most communities are on or very near the water and boat launches are plentiful. No matter where you are in the region, you can be on the water within 20 minutes - and often, a whole lot
