Cloudsplitter Scenic Gondola Ride at Whiteface Mountain Ski Center

The heated eight-passenger Cloudsplitter Gondola takes you from the base lodge to the top of Little Whiteface in less than 15 minutes. The ride takes you over ski trails, wooded areas and scenic overlooks with breathtaking views. At the summit of Little Whiteface, an observation deck, picnic tables and awesome views await.

2 MacKenzie-Intervale Ski Jumping Complex & Kodak Sports Park

Open year round. Call for a training schedule. **SKI JUMPING:** As you drive into Lake Placid on Route 73 you can't help but notice the huge 120-meter and 90-meter ski jump towers. This is where top North American ski jumpers perfect their art and compete winter and summer. Ride the chairlift up alongside the jumping hills and then take an elevator 26-stories to the top of the 120-meter tower for an unforgettable view looking straight down the ski jump – the same view athletes have just before pushing off. The glass enclosed tower also provides views of the surrounding countryside and

FREESTYLE JUMPING: Watch as the best aerial freestyle skiers on the globe practice their craft in training and participate in competitions. The athletes propel themselves 60 to 70 feet into the air to execute maneuvers like a full-double-full or full-full-full.

The Olympic Center houses 4 ice surfaces, convention space and the 1932/1980 Winter Olympic Museum (Daily, 10am-5pm). The legendary "Miracle on Ice" hockey game took place here during the 1980 Olympic Winter Games. Memorable special events, ice shows, concerts and sports competitions continue to be held here throughout the year. Year-round you can ice skate indoors at the Olympic Center; call for the public skating schedule. Skate rentals available.

Weekends and Holidays, 1-3pm and 7-9pm. Rentals available.
Skate on the same surface where legendary speed skater Eric Heiden made Olympic history in 1980 when he won an unprecedented five gold medals. National and North American races are held here and there's a good chance you'll see athletes in training.

U.S. athletes gather at this facility to prepare for international competitions and the Olympic games, both summer and winter. Free 15-minute tour and video presentation.

Athletes train daily, year-round on three refrigerated luge start ramps.

Open year round. Exciting International and World Cup competitions take place throughout the winter at the Olympic Sports Complex, home to the planet's newest and most challenging combined track for bobsled, luge and skeleton racing. Watch, if you can, as competitors fly past your face at 80 miles-per-hour. The track measures one mile in length with 20 curves and about five G's of force. In summer take a trolly ride tour of the facility and watch as professional drivers take pedestrians on a hair-raising wheeled bobsled ride.

HALF-MILE BOBSLED RIDES

Dec 26 to close, Wed-Sun, 10am-12:30pm, 1-4pm. Ride with a professional driver and brakeman down the original 1932/1980 Olympic bobsed track through the famous Zig Zag turns. The custom sleds are built for a safe, comfortable and exhilarating ride of a lifetime.


LUGE ROCKET RIDES

Dec 11 to close, Sat-Sun, 12-2pm, Mon-Tue, 10am-12:30pm, 1-4pm. Pilot your own semi-enclosed, modified luge sled on the newly-constructed combined track. Your Rocket ride will take you through 16 of the most heart-pounding, smile producing curves in the world.

December-March, 9am-4pm daily 50km of cross country skiing and snowshoe trails wind through the forests and meadows of the Olympic Sports Complex, the site of International and National Champion-ship events.
